Welcome to the Smithsonian

The Smithsonian was established in 1846 with funds bequeathed to the United States by James Smithson, an English scientist, "for the increase and diffusion of knowledge."

When you visit the Smithsonian today, you're entering the world's largest museum complex, with 19 museums and the National Zoo, holding approximately 155 million artifacts and specimens in trust for the American people. Ten museums are located along the National Mall, six others and the Smithsonian's National Zoo are nearby, and two more are in New York City. The Smithsonian Castle and the Arts and Industries Building are closed for renovation until further notice.
